# CP backs down on hardline policy of forced removal

THE Conservative Party has backed away from a hardline policy of forcibly moving black people out of Albert Park and has said that a CP government would use a system of fines to make the area all white again.

At most political meetings of CP and National Party candidates, CP supporters have slammed the Government for not instantly, ruthlessly and rigidly enforcing the Group Areas Act.

CP supporters have demanded that the Government send the South African Police into mixed suburbs such as Albert Park to boot out all the black people living there illegally.

But Mr Carl Werth, deputy chairman of the CP in Natal and the candidate in Umbilo, has said in a letter to 2 000

Albert Park voters: "There will be no forced removals or midnight raids in Albert Park."

Mr Werth has previously criticised the NP Umbilo candidate Mr Piet Matthee for saying forced removals in Albert Park would not be in South Africa's interest.

Mrs Carole Charlewood, the Democratic Party candidate, has said that official programmes should be undertaken to help black and white tenants to learn to live together.

Mr Werth said that to achieve a safe, clean white Albert Park a CP government "could issue a notice to the owners of the flats concerned that illegal residents are to vacate the premises by a given date."
